Cathedral Counseling Center has developed an Affiliate Program to meet the specific supervision needs of newcomers to the field. The program is intended for mental health professionals in their first years of practicing psychotherapy who seek high-quality individual supervision from seasoned clinicians. On a sliding-scale basis, the Counseling Center now makes available licensed supervisors to members of the mental health community who wish to develop increased clinical competence within the context of a supportive relationship. Both LCPC and LCSW supervisors are available. All supervisors have at least 10 years of clinical experience.

CONSULTATION GROUP

Cathedral Counseling Center additionally offers a Consultation Group to newer mental health professionals.
